


ZAMBIA PARKS 14 days

Itinerary:



Day 1 : Arrive Lower Zambezi National Park (L / D)

Upon arrival at the Royal Airstrip of the Lower Zambezi National Park, transfer to the camp.

Lodging: Chongwe River Camp

Day 2 : Lower Zambezi National Park (B / L / D)

Flanked by the Zambezi Escarpment and the Zambezi River, the forested valley of the Lower Zambezi is a haven for abundant birds and wildlife. The region is especially wonderful for large elephant herds, diverse birdlife, and wild dog, providing the opportunity for great wildlife encounters.

Lodging: Chongwe River Camp

Day 3 : Lower Zambezi National Park (B / L / D)

The Lower Zambezi National Park, founded in 1983, covers an area of 4,092 square kilometers along the northwestern bank of the Zambezi River. Step on board on a boat or drift silently pass the riverbank in a canoe for the best wildlife viewing, since most wildlife is concentrated around the Lower Zambezi Valley and the river.

Lodging: Chongwe River Camp

Day 4 : Lower Zambezi National Park (B / L / D)

The Zambezi River valley is known for abundant wildlife, including buffalo, fish eagles and herds of elephants. Canoes ply the river, which is home to hippos and crocodiles. Leopard, lion, buffalo and over 400 bird species all gather in this mesmerizing wilderness.

Lodging: Chongwe River Camp

Day 5 : Lower Zambezi National Park - South Luangwa National Park (B / L / D)

After a morning activity and breakfast transfer by scheduled flight to Mfuwe International airport. Upon arrival transfer to the lodge, situated within the boundaries of the National Park.

Lodging: Time + Tide Chinzombo Lodge

Day 6 : South Luangwa National Park (B / L / D)

The South Luangwa National Park is Zambia's premier wildlife destination and offers world-class predator action, large herds of elephant, and many endemic species. This is an unspoiled wilderness of tranquil rivers, ancient forests and open pans.

Lodging: Time + Tide Chinzombo Lodge

Day 7 : South Luangwa National Park (B / L / D)

Known to locals as simply 'the South Park,' it was initially founded as the Luangwa Game Park in 1904, and converted to one of three game reserves in 1938. The impressive park covers an area of about 9050 square kilometers of the Luangwa Valley floor.

Lodging: Time + Tide Chinzombo Lodge

Day 8 : South Luangwa National Park (B / L / D)

The South Luangwa National Park western and northwestern edge is bounded by the Muchinga Escarpment, and the southern border lined with the meandering Luangwa River. There is an abundance of dramatic and fascinating topography in this stunning game rich park.

Lodging: Time + Tide Chinzombo Lodge

Day 9 : South Luangwa National Park - Lusaka (B)

After breakfast today it is time to bid farewell to South Luangwa National Park and leave by scheduled flight to Lusaka, the capital of Zambia. Lusaka's sprawling city market, located in the centre of town, sells clothing, produce and other goods which is worth exploring during this free afternoon.

Lodging: Latitude 15 Degree Hotel

Day 10 : Lusaka - Liuwa Plain National Park (B / L / D)

In the morning after breakfast transfer to the airport for your scheduled flight to Liuwa Plain National Park. Upon arrival transfer to the first permanent luxury lodge built in the park, the King Lewanika Lodge is truly uniquely positioned in this extraordinary wilderness.

Lodging: Time + Tide King Lewanika Lodge

Day 11 : Liuwa Plain National Park (B / L / D)

Liuwa Plain is unspoilt and exclusive with rare game and a rich natural heritage. It is home to Africa's second largest wildebeest migration, the Lady Liuwa lion pride, cheetahs, and clans of hyenas. With the vast plains, dramatic skies, magnificent birdlife, and annual wildflower blooms, Liuwa Plain is a photographer's dream come true.

Lodging: Time + Tide King Lewanika Lodge

Day 12 : Liuwa Plain National Park (B / L / D)

The Liuwa National Park has one of the oldest conservation histories in Africa, dating back to the 19th century where the King of Barotseland, Lubosi Lewanika, appointed his people to be the custodians of the park and its wildlife. It is maintained till this day by the people living within the park. Liuwa is a prime example how people and wildlife can co-exist and thrive.

Lodging: Time + Tide King Lewanika Lodge

Day 13 : Liuwa Plain National Park (B / L / D)

The park's grasslands support a variety of large mammals, including tens of thousands of blue wildebeest, whose annual migration is Africa's second-largest. It is also home to Africa's densest concentration of endangered wattled cranes and more than 300 bird species. The landscape here holds a special magic in every season. From dramatic thunderstorms building up to awe-inspiring spectacles that refill the pans. When the plains are flooded during the season, the shimmering blue lagoons are dotted with lilies and large flocks of wading birds moving like calligraphy across the land.

Lodging: Time + Tide King Lewanika Lodge

Day 14 : Liuwa Plain National Park Departure (B)

After a final morning activity, depart from the lodge for your scheduled flight to Lusaka to connect to your international return flight.
