ZIMBABWE WATERS



Day 1: Arrival Harare - Mana Pools

On arrival in Harare connect for a short flight to Nyamatusi Camp in the heart of Mana Pools National Park.

Day 2: Mana Pools

Mana Pools National Park is in the far north of Zimbabwe. It includes the south bank and islands of the Zambezi River, which forms the border with Zambia. The park is known for wildlife visibility beside the river and in the flood plains. Large populations of elephants, hippos and Nile crocodiles gather at sunrise in the Long Pool. In the park's south, lions wait for prey around the waterhole at Chitake Spring.

Day 3: Mana Pools - Lake Kariba

After breakfast depart via scheduled flight to Bumi Hills, set overlooking the magnificent Lake Kariba on a range of remote hills in one of Zimbabwe's finest wilderness locations. With the Zambezi escarpment as its backdrop, this haven of serenity overlooks the eternal shimmering waters of Lake Kariba below and a shoreline rich with wildlife.

Day 4 : Lake Kariba

Lake Kariba is the world's largest man-made lake and reservoir by volume. It lies 1,300 kilometres upstream from the Indian Ocean, along the border between Zambia and Zimbabwe. Fish eagles, cormorants and other water birds patrol the shorelines, as do large numbers of elephants and other big game species including lion, cheetah, leopard, buffalo and a myriad of smaller plains game species.

Day 5 : Lake Kariba - Hwange National Park

Today after an early morning activity transfer by scheduled flight to Hwange National Park, Zimbabwe's biggest reserve, home to a profusion of wildlife, including giraffe, lion, zebra and approximately 40,000 elephants. It provides sanctuary for endangered species, including a population of wild dogs thought to be among the most sizeable surviving groups on the continent.

Day 6: Hwange National Park

Hwange National Park is in west Zimbabwe. Its grasslands and mopane woods are home to large elephant herds. Wildlife sighting here include, kudu, sable antelope, zebra, wildebeest, gemsbok, the rare and endangered roan antelope, buffalo, giraffe, lion, leopard, hyena and many other species.

Day 7: Hwange National Park - Victoria Falls

After an early morning activity transfer by scheduled flight to Victoria Falls. One of the original natural wonders of the world, the Victoria Falls is known locally as 'The Smoke that Thunders' and presents a spectacular sight of awe-inspiring beauty and grandeur.

Day 8: Victoria Falls

The Victoria Falls is a waterfall on the Zambezi River, which provides habitat for several unique species of plants and animals. It is located on the border between Zambia and Zimbabwe and is considered to be one of the world's largest waterfalls due to its width of 1,708 metres. Spend the day exploring this magnificent sight.

Day 9 : Victoria Falls Departure

After breakfast transfer to the airport for your international return flight.
